Dear Friends of Kairos,

Have you noticed the extreme changes in the weather recently? They are getting scary. These changes are not occurring simply in one region but throughout the world. In many places, temperatures are soaring way above 100°F. In some areas, heavy rain is turning roads into rivers. Even the "gentle" volcano Kilauea in Hawaii has erupted violently beyond any expectation. Are these phenomena occurring because nature is mimicking humanity's increasingly twisted mentality? Is nature just doing some stretching exercises or is it the result of underground nuclear testing by some fanatical persons? How to tell whether a person is a true public servant who wants to create a better future for his people or just a shameless politician who wants to satisfy his selfish desires? Facing such a society, should we, as the children of God, lift our hands up to pray and plead for His mercy and deliverance? For those who have been called to serve the Lord, is it time to step out of the comfort zone?

The world-renowned oil tycoon John D Rockefeller was a serious businessman. One day while walking around the offices, he saw one of his employees reclining in the chair, feet on the desk, and eyes half closed. That employee didn't even move when the Boss walked by. Rockefeller wanted to fire the employee, but hesitated, and asked this employee: "What are you doing?" The employee said: "There is a problem with my task that is bothering me, and I am trying to figure out a solution." Rockefeller took out a notepad and wrote a few words on it. He then told the employee to take it to the payroll department. The words he wrote were: "Give this person a raise." Obviously, Rockefeller admired this employee because, instead of just following a routine to work thoughtlessly, he was using his "brain"!

In Luke 16:1-12, Jesus told the parable of the "Shrewd Manager" to his disciples. A rich master was about to fire his dishonest manager. This manager realized that he had no strength for physical labor and was too proud to beg for food, so he used his brain to scheme a way to survive after being fired. In the end, the master "commended" this dishonest manager for acting shrewdly. Of course, Jesus was not teaching us to be shrewd and dishonest. He just wanted to emphasize the importance of using our brains.

Dear pastors, elders, brothers, and sisters, as we face a rapidly changing world, should we keep on doing the "same old same old"? Or should we use our brains to create new and novel ways to deliver the Gospel? The Kairos ministry is in the business of creating new and novel ways to deliver God's Word to those in spiritual need. We pray for your partnership and support.

At this point, please allow me to share with you a thanksgiving testimony. Kairos is located in an old factory building. After moving in, we realized that when it rained, the roof leaked. The roof is worn out and desperately in need to be replaced. The estimates to replace the roof were upwards of US\$100,000. We thank God for donations that continue to be sent in for this purpose. Then on Friday, July 6, we were experiencing record high temperatures here in Los Angeles. The air conditioner on the roof of the small storage room in the back of our building failed to withstand the heat and a fire broke out. Thick smoke was blown to the carrepair business next door. Upon noticing the fire on top of our building, the owner, who is a brother in Christ, immediately led his staff to help extinguish the fire while alerting our office (located at the front of the building) to call 911. This incident prompted us to seriously address our roof problems. Please pray for provision of the right contractor and for the much needed funds of \$100,000 to replace the roof.
