THE "COMPANION WALKMAN" MINISTRY

The Hong Kong branch of Kairos is actively preparing for the release of an updated version of the "Companion Walkman" in Cantonese. The updated Bible study program will expand from the original 21 volumes to 31 volumes. Additionally, it will include over a thousand episodes of the "Melodies of Life" devotional program, comforting "Prayer: Peace Series," and a collection of beautiful hymns for praise and worship.

The "Companion Walkman" device incorporates meticulously crafted Bible study programs by Kairos over the past 35 years. It includes the "Bible Guide" and "Audio Bible Study" series, as well as selections of devotions and hymn collections, totaling 600 hours of content. The device allows for offline playback, meaning it does not require an internet connection. The accompanying catalog provides a clear listing of audio file numbers for each volume of the Old and New Testaments, allowing listeners to easily navigate and select the desired content. Importantly, there are separate devices available for Cantonese and Mandarin, accommodating the language preferences of individual users. Furthermore, Kairos provides free updates of the chip content every six months, ensuring users have access to the latest version.

BIBLE STUDY SERIES PRODUCTION UPDATE

The "Minor Prophets" and "Pauline Epistles" Combined Bible Study Series, created by Kairos, serves as a Bible study resource for pastors and Christians in Chinese-speaking churches worldwide. It is used as a curriculum in Kairos Institute and is available on the website www.kairos-elearn.org. These two series, consisting of nearly 20,000 sets of printed and electronic materials, have also been distributed to pastors, theology students, and volunteer leaders in mainland China who are in need. They provide assistance in equipping and edifying them in the study of the Bible. The production of the "Major Prophets" Bible study series is also nearing completion, and it is anticipated to be finished and available for use in the first quarter.
