## Cantonese Bible Study Series of the Twelve Minor

The many thought the Old Testament, known as the Twelve Minor Prophets, provide messages that were relevant to the circumstances and needs of that time. The topics covered include religious, moral, political, ethical, and social aspects, which are still closely related to our present-day living environment. Among the Twelve Minor Prophets, four books contain prophecies directed towards foreign nations, including the books of Obadiah, Jonah, Nahum, and Habakkuk. The final three books, Haggai, Zechariah, and Malachi, deliver prophecies to the people of God after their return from exile and are known as the post-exilic books. The Cantonese ministry's program "The Bible Sounds Good" has produced study materials for these seven Old Testament books. The books of Obadiah, Jonah, Habakkuk, and Malachi have already been released, and currently, the book of Zechariah is being uploaded. The books of Haggai and Nahum will follow subsequently.
